High School Scholarship Details

The details below were developed to determine the application procedure, award amounts and selection criteria for scholarships. These guidelines may change at the discretion of the Southeast Iowa Regional Medical Center Auxiliary, Scholarship Committee. Scholarship recipients will be chosen by the committee.

Scholarship criteria

- Scholarships are financial aid for studying for a health care career at an accredited community college, technical institute or four-year college or university.
- Scholarships of equal value will be awarded to students graduating from high schools in Southeast Iowa Regional Medical Center's service area. Nontraditional students also are eligible.
- Awards will be based on grades, leadership, character, community involvement and financial need.

Application process

- Complete the scholarship application.
- Get a copy of your high school transcript (if you are a high school senior).
- Write an essay of 500 or more words stating why you are a deserving candidate. Include
 how you meet the criteria, your career objectives and how you plan to reach them. List
 any professional and academic experiences, awards, and achievements. Describe how you
 have demonstrated a positive commitment to your school and community.
- Obtain letters of support from one professional and one personal reference who are not related to you.
- Make a copy of your estimated family contribution (EFC) from your FAFSA or, if you are a nontraditional student, copies of your last two federal income tax forms.
- Send your application to Auxiliary Scholarship Committee, Volunteer Services, Southeast Iowa Regional Medical Center, 1221 S. Gear Ave., West Burlington, IA 52655.
- The deadline for all materials is April 1.

Award process

Scholarships will be announced at school award ceremonies in May or by email or telephone. Recipients will receive a check payable to the educational institution of their choice to be used for educational expenses.
