



Massage also helps promote better sleep, improves concentration, reduces anxiety, and creates an overall sense of well-being. Many people have regular massage therapy to relieve the stress and tension of everyday living, maintain good health and reduce stress. Also, massage is accepted as part of many physical rehabilitation programs which has proven beneficial for many chronic conditions, including low back pain, arthritis, bursitis, fatique, high blood pressure, diabetes and fibromyalgia.
